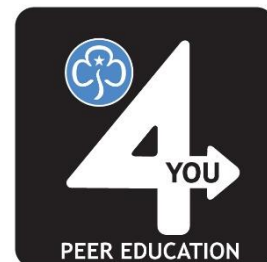

Peer Education Basic Training **Saturday 14 – Sunday 15 September 2024**

Where is the training?

The training will be held at:

Where will we be staying?

What travel expenses can I claim?

You will be required to pay the first £25 of your own travel expenses, after this you may claim any reasonable travel expenses back (mileage is paid at 45p per mile).

How old do I have to be to attend?

You must be aged between 14 and 25. Members who are aged under 18 will require a consent form signed by their parent or guardians.

What are the times of the training?

The times are: -

Saturday 9:00am – 5:00 pm

Sunday 9:00 am – 3:00 pm

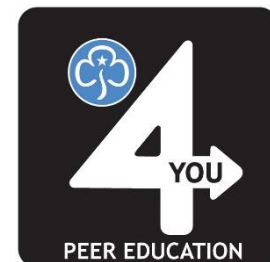
This is an overnight event, the training will finish approximately 5pm, allowing for the participants to travel to the campsite via minibus and join in the young leader activities, including an outdoor cinema and silent disco.

What is the cost for the training?

- If you are attending for the full weekend the cost of the training is £25, at the end of the training you will get a t-shirt, peer education certificate and topic training badge.
- For those who are only attending 1 day of training it will be £10.
- If you are a young leader who has done peer education basic training before, you can attend Saturday's young leader event and Sunday's topic training it will be £25.

How do I pay?

How will I know if my application has been successful?

Once we have received your online application and your payment, we will email you to let you know your application has been successful. We will also provide further details including what you need to bring etc.

What preparation do I need to do?

There are three pieces of preparation to complete before the training:

1. Where possible, you should attend a peer education session and watch another peer educator in action. This will help you to understand more about peer education and decide if you want to become a peer educator.

You MUST complete the "Become a peer educator" [e-learning](#).

2. This is a mandatory requirement before you attend the training session, and you will need to provide a copy of your certificate in advance of the training weekend.
3. You must have completed a safe space Levels 1 and 2, or a safe space for 14-17-year-olds.

Do I need to bring food?

No, food will be provided.

What do I wear to the training?

Can I use the training towards my Queen's Guide award?

Being a peer educator can count towards Element 1 of the Queen's Guide award after you've delivered 20 hours of sessions.
