

All About Inspire

This challenge badge is aimed at Rangers and young leaders to show them what Inspire is and what it has to offer them once they turn 18. Inspire members can also complete the activities to earn the badge as an introduction to Inspire.

The Badge is split into 7 sections to follow the 7 pathways that form Inspire. People need to complete at least 1 clause from each section. This can be adapted depending on the needs of the individual.

Adventure and challenge



- Have a go at an adventure based activity.
- Go on a hike, explore somewhere new.
- Find out and produce something to share with others about a female adventurer.
- Create a task master style event to run with a unit or group.
- Push yourself to do something new, challenge yourself to have a go at something you've wanted to try for a while.
- Apply for Go for GOLD.

Voice and action

- What is Parliament Week? How can you get involved?
- Become an advocate.
- Support a Girlguiding campaign.
- Raise awareness for a larger campaign outside of Girlguiding.
- Go on a protest or a march.
- Join a Task and Finish group.



Beyond the UK



- Which Guiding centre would you go to? Plan a trip with full costs.
 - Complete a craft from each country that has a World Centre.
 - Find out about WAGGGS, what is a resource pool, when can you apply to volunteer?
 - Try a food from each of the countries that our Guiding centres are in, what was your favourite?
 - Visit a World centre, explain to someone who hasn't been there what it was like.
- Can you run an activity based on WAGGGS with your unit or for an Inspire collective?
 - Find out about other international trips through Girlguiding, would you apply for it as a participant or a leader?

Sharing skills

- How do people share skills? What events in Girlguiding promote the sharing of skills? Think of skills you can share, create a plan for a session you might run on these skills.
- Do you know someone who has a skill you want to learn? Ask them if they would teach you?
- Can you share a skill with another person/group (inside or outside of Girlguiding, different ages etc.)
- Go to a county training day
- Start a new skill you have wanted to learn
- Create a video or instructions for someone else to follow your skill. Consider language barriers and disabilities.



Events experience



- Take your unit on a camp or event, or help to take them away.
- Complete the camp permit, or going away with scheme.
- Join a service team.
- Help your district or division plan and run an event.
- Attend a county Inspire event.
- Attend a region Inspire event.

Leading the way

- Join a younger unit and act as a young leader or unit helper.
- Lead an activity or game in your unit, another unit or with another group.
- What are the different leadership styles, which one are you? Take a test and find out.
- Complete your young leadership award, or complete your adult leadership qualification.
- Lead a group through a challenge.
- Can you become a lead organiser for an event or a trip?



Developing others



- Find out what the peer educator role is, can you sign up to become one?
- Find out about mentoring young leaders.
- Support a new girl in the unit, help them to feel confident in their new environment.
- Find out about mentoring adult leaders.
- Become a Girlguiding trainer.
- Become a Girlguiding ambassador.
