Peer education weekend & day training

How can I find out more about peer education?

When is the event?

Friday 6 – Sunday 8 March – weekend training (includes basic training to become a peer educator and topic training on Think Resilient).

Sunday 8 March – day training (Think Resilient topic training only)

Where is the training?

The training will be held at: The Mills House, Girlguiding Worcestershire county camp site, Blackmore, Hanley Swan, Malvern WR8 0EE

Where will we be staying?

The Mills House, Worcestershire.

What travel expenses can I claim?

Transport to and from the venue is not included.

How old do I have to be to attend?

You must be aged between 14 and 25. Members who are aged under 18 will require a consent form signed by their parent or guardians.

What are the times of the weekend?

- Friday arrival: Between 6:30pm and 7:00pm
- Friday training: 8:00pm – 8:45pm
- Saturday training: 9:00am – 5:00pm
- Sunday training: 9:00am – 4:00pm

This is an overnight event; the training will finish approximately 4pm on the Sunday.

What is the cost for the training?

- If you are attending for the full weekend the cost of the training is £50, at the end of the training you will get a t-shirt, peer education certificate and topic training badge.
- For those who are only attending 1 day of training it will be £10.

How do I pay?

How will I know if my application has been successful?

Once we have received your online application and your payment, we will email you to let you know your application has been successful. We will also provide further details including what you need to bring etc.

What preparation do I need to do?

There are three pieces of preparation to complete before the training:

1. Where possible, you should attend a peer education session and watch another peer educator in action. This will help you to understand more about peer education and decide if you want to become a peer educator.
2. You **must** complete the "Become a peer educator" e-learning. This is a mandatory requirement before you attend the training session, and you will need to provide a copy of your certificate in advance of the training weekend.
3. You must have completed either the safer guiding training, safe space levels 1 and 2, or a safe space for 14–17-yearolds.

Do I need to bring food?

No, food will be provided.

What do I wear to the training?

Whatever you will be comfortable in that is also (ideally) Girlguiding branded.

Can I use the training towards my Queen's Guide award?

Being a peer educator can count towards the guiding challenge element for either girl or volunteer however, we do not recommend you using it as your 50 hour project as this depends on how many sessions your county require you to run.
